It is my pleasure to inform that NTQLS has been accomplishing various milestones since its operations. During the period from January 2018 to 31st December 2018, various strategies plan have been formulated to achieve its objective.

Events like Bachpan Gully- A Morning street fete; Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital's doctors and students training were held. One week training was provided to newly appointed counsellors and supervisors by NTQLS team. Counsellors from Tata Memorial Centre (TMC), Mumbai visited NTQLS, Delhi for learning telephonic counselling, strategies of telephonic counselling of tobacco cessation, problem handling of callers, checking data accuracy and data base maintenance. Three posters were presented by the Supervisor of NTQLS at NAPCON-2018 National Conference of Pulmonary Diseases.

National Tobacco Quitline Services – A Brief Introduction

"National Tobacco Quitline Services" was launched and inaugurated by Honorable Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India Shri Jagat Prakash Nadda on 30thMay 2016. The project is financially supported by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and runs under the guidance of Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute, University of Delhi, institution has the unique privilege of being the first provider of free tobacco cessation counseling across the country with the sole objective of making people free from the diseases caused by tobacco and aims to guit tobacco for a healthier life. This Quitline is accessed through a toll free no. 1800-11-2356. It is operational 6 days a week, (Tuesday to Sunday 8AM to 8PM) following WHO protocol of Quitline services. National Tobacco Quitline Services (NTQLS) is a population-wide, confidential, non-judgmental telephonic counseling, information and referral service for anyone seeking help for their own or for another person to cease tobacco use. The program is headed under the supervision of Prof. Raj Kumar, Director, Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute, University of Delhi. The primary aim of this Tobacco Quitline Service is to provide free-of-cost counseling to people from every part of the country with a broader perspective of minimizing the problems caused by tobacco, and it also includes providing them educational material through e-mails and posts. In NTQLS, the counsellor focuses on individual and provides personalized assistance to each caller, helps them to understand the benefits of quitting tobacco, regardless of whether the caller is ready or not ready to quit.

The process begins when the client calls on the Tobacco Quitline toll free number 1800-11-2356. The client chooses his/her preferred language either English or Hindi. The number of the client gets registered and during the first inbound call some information is taken from the client so that the counselor could help them to quit. After the first inbound call a quit date is set as per the convenience and the severity of the client and subsequent follow ups are arranged by the counsellor. A total of 4 follow ups are taken by the counselor with in a span of 1 month to understand the status of the client and if there is a need of subsequent counseling by the client. During this process the client can call any time if he/she is facing any withdrawal symptom.

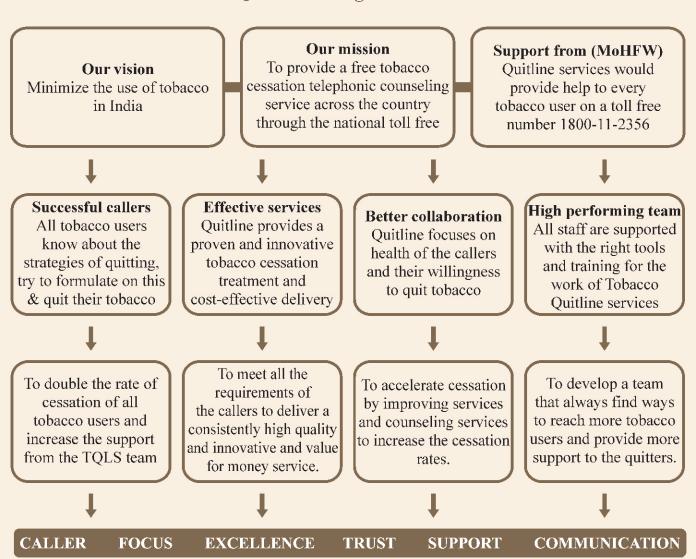
Journey of National Tobacco Quit Line Services

The National Tobacco Quitline Services started from 8th April, 2011. The Meeting was held at the chamber of Additional Director General health services; Nirman Bhawan between Dr. V.K Vijayan (former Director of VPCI), Prof. Raj Kumar (Head, NCRAAI, VPCI) and Dr. Dinesh Bhatnagar (ADG, General health services, MoHFW) for setting up Tobacco Quit line. After this meeting, there were many subsequent meetings conducted. On April 18th 2011, the proposal for se setting up of Quitline Services sent to ADG, General Health Services Nirman Bhawan. On 10th July, 2014 a letter received from MoHFW for resubmitting the proposal for setting up Tobacco Quitline at VPCI. On 14th August 2014, a Fresh proposal



proposal submitted for setting up Tobacco Quitline at VPCI. The first installment of an amount of 49, 58, 000 rupees for setting up Tobacco Quitline Services from MOHFW was released on 13th January 2015. On 9th June, 2015 an advertisement for recruitment of staff was released in Hindustan Times and Times of India. The recruitment of the NTQLS staff was scheduled from 7th October to 9th October 2015 and a meeting was held with the joint secretary. On 5th January, 2016 the supervisors were recruited. A meeting was held on 12 of February 2016 with the joint secretary of Ministry of Health and family welfare. A meeting was held on 16th march 2016 for the finalization of educational material for counselors, supervisors and public. Another meeting was held on 25th of April 2016 for the finalization of Interactive Voice Response (IVR) and software questionnaire.

Events and training

The distribution of educational material kit amongst the audience was done by the counselors and supervisors along with clarification of their doubts and giving away the important information to enhance their knowledge. We successfully promoted our toll free number at mass level. A positive feedback was received from the visitor's side and they praised our work as it's a great initiative by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India.

The training program of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital's Doctors and M.Phil students was organized by Dr. Smita Deshpandey Professor and Head Department of Psychiatry, Dr. RML hospital & PGIMER with the coordination of Dr. Raj Kumar, Director, Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute at National Tobacco Quit Line Services. It was conducted two times 3rd - 27th July, 2018 and 25th Sep- 9th Oct, 2018. Total 55 M. Phil students including Doctors participated in this training program in order to perceive knowledge of telephonic counseling; difference between face to face counseling and telephonic counseling, strategies of telephonic counseling of tobacco cessation. It was one month long training in which different students visited NTQLS in small groups and observed NTQLS counselors while counseling. They learnt the different ways of handling cross questioning and checking data accuracy. The training was ended with the spirit of making India Tobacco free.

Tata Memorial Centre (TMC), Mumbai visit at NTQLS

Now counseling is available in regional languages. Tata Memorial Centre (TMC), Mumbai is one of them. One week training was provided to newly appointed 2 counselors and 2 supervisors on the functioning of National Tobacco Quitline Services at Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute (VPCI), New Delhi by NTQLS team. Tata Memorial Centre (TMC), Mumbai's counselors and supervisors observed NTQLS team very closely. They learnt telephonic counseling, strategies of telephonic counseling of tobacco cessation, problem handling of callers, checking data accuracy and data base maintenance. The training was ended with the zeal of working in synergy to provide tobacco cessation counseling to every person who wants to quit tobacco.

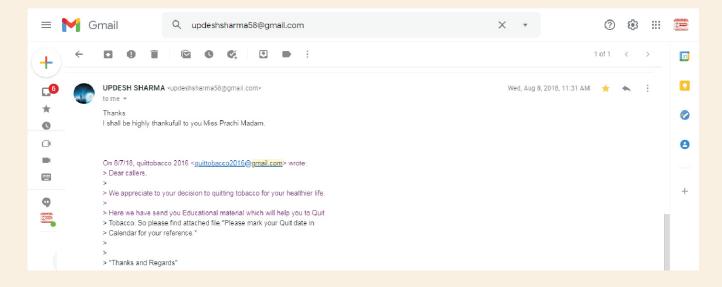




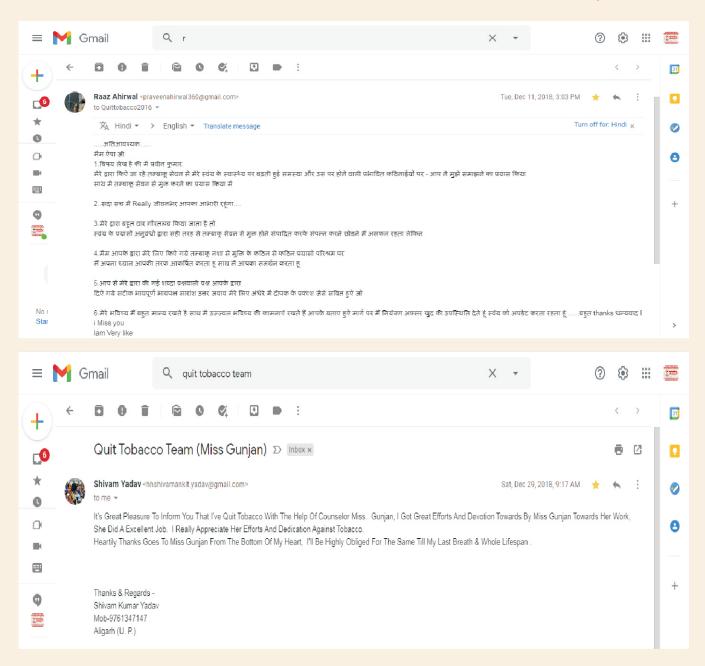

From 1st January 2018 to 31st December 2018, some of the feedbacks received from the callers are given below.





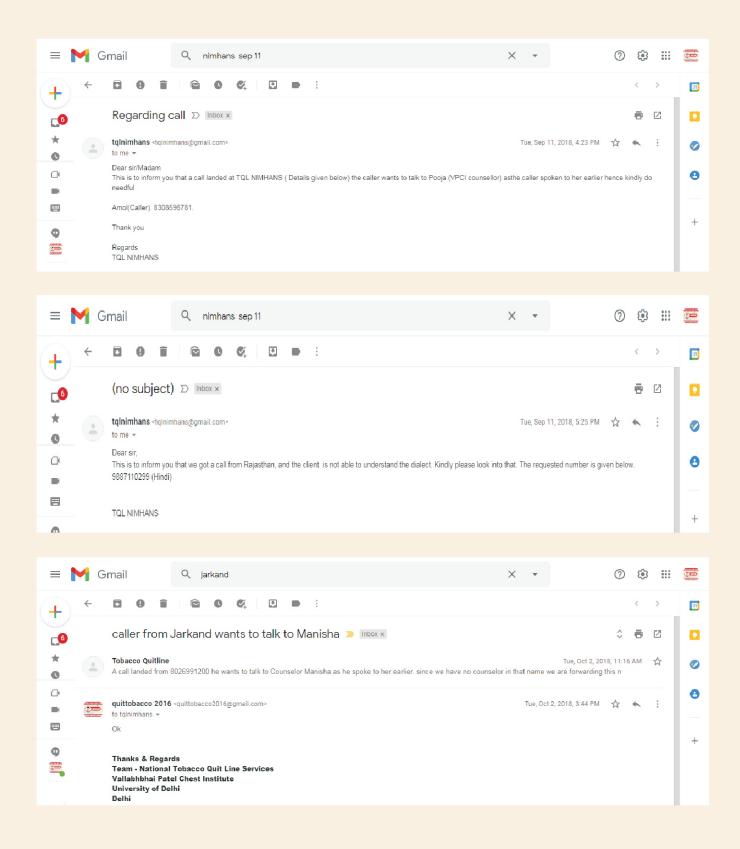


Mails from our regional satellite center, National Institute of Mental Health & Neuron Sciences (NIMHANS), Bangalore.

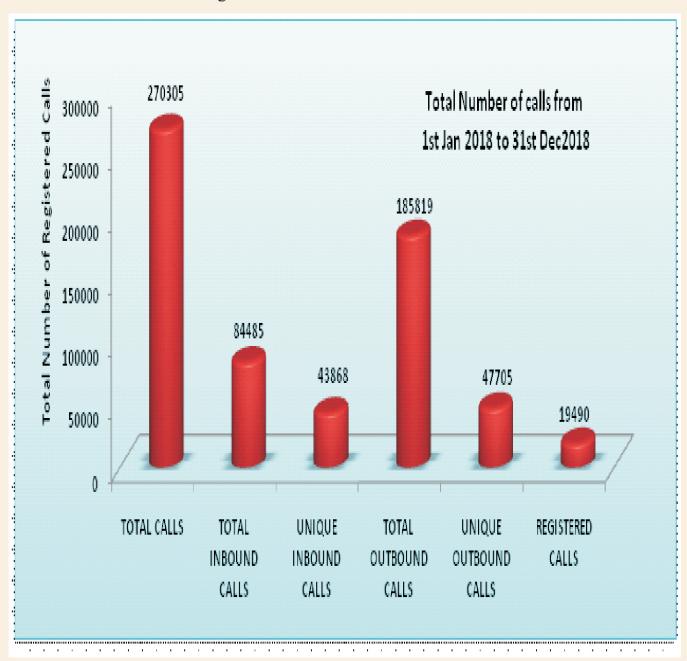




NTQLS FINDINGS AND RESULTS

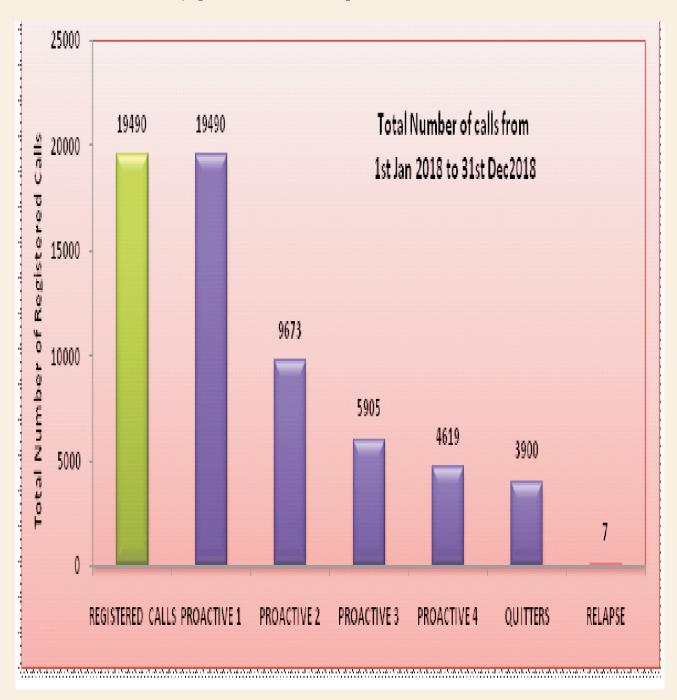
Statistical analysis of data from 1st January 2018 – 31st December 2018

Identification of calls: total calls made by the counselor to respective callers during this period were 270305. In these 185819 were out bounds calls, 47705 callers were identified unique means rest number was repeated by the same person. Of all 84485 inbound calls, 43868 unique which callers were identified. Of these entire inbound and outbound calls, a total of 19490 callers were registered for tobacco cessation.



IDENTIFICATION OF CALLS

Call Progress: Of all these registered callers (N=19490) for tobacco cessation, 19490 proactive calls-1 and 9673 proactive calls-2 were made to the callers. Callers reached to proactive calls-3 were 5905 and 4619 callers reached to proactive calls-4. Total of 3900 callers have successfully quitted till the fourth proactive calls.

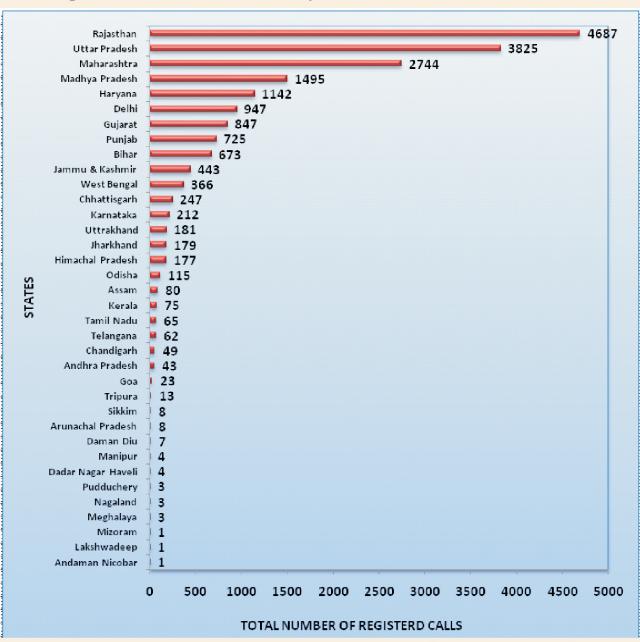


Call Progress of Total Quit Date Set And Successful Quitters During This Period



NUMBER OF REGISTERED CALLERS FROM DIFFERENT STATES DURING THE PERIOD 1ST JANUARY 2018 to 31ST DECEMBER 2018

Calls to NTQLS helpline for seeking tobacco cessation counseling were made from every state of the country; most of the calls were from Rajasthan i.e. 24.05% followed by Uttar Pradesh 19.63%, Maharashtra 14.08%, Madhya Pradesh 7.67%, Haryana and Delhi i.e 5.86% and 4.86% respectively. Number of calls from North Eastern region and some of the Union Territories were less, calls from Meghalaya, Mizoram and Nagaland were 7, and Dadar& Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu has only 11 calls.
